Case Summary

The chorionic villi show abnormal polyploid configurations. The villous stroma is hypercellular and myxoid with stellate fibroblasts and prominent karyorrhectic debris. Subtle abnormal, circumferential villous trophoblastic proliferation is also present. The morphological features are characteristic for very early complete mole. DNA genotyping demonstrates a heterozygous/dispermic androgenetic-only profile.
